

The following Titles are given to the rulers of Varggard depending on its size and rank within the EMP:

The Following are positions within Varggard:

- **Huscarls**
  - Housecarls were professional warriors in the service of a lord or king. They were highly trained and well-armed and provided protection to their leader. These are our Knights.
- **Dróttinn**
  - Is the head of the largest household within Vargaard. Giving them the special title and privileges within Varggard.
    - The Drottinn is seated at the head of the Chieftains Table.
    - They can reserve their votes till last.
- **Chieftain**
  - Is the head of a household within Vargaard.
  - They receive 1 vote for every 5 members within their house.
- **Stivardr or Steward**
  - Is responsible for running Varggards day to day operations and advising the crown on things that need to be purchased as well as helping plan events and running things in the absence of the crown.
- **Gjaldkeri or Exchequer**
  - Is responsible for managing and collecting funds for Varggard.
- **Hersir or Marshal**
  - Is responsible for overseeing the training, safety and adherence to the combat rules for Varggard within the EMP.

- **Skotvordr or Archery Marshal**
  - oversees the training, safety and adherence to the rules of everything archery related for Varggard within the EMP.
- **Ulfstallari or the Wolf Herald**
  - Is responsible for running court ceremonies as well as announcements.
- **Drengr or Champion**
  - Is the champion for Varggard. They are chosen from the populace of Varggard through a series of challenges. The highest scoring individual wins the award and sits as Champion for one year.

## Awards

### Order of Chivalry

- Members of this Order are either Knights or Masters at Arms, depending on whether or not they wished to swear fealty to the Thrones. They are elevated to this rank for their ability on the field and for their courtesy and chivalry both on and off the field. Knights swear fealty to the Crown, and are considered to be vassals of the crown, while Masters at Arms may swear fealty to an individual crown if they so desire. Knights wear white belts, and chains of large single links, and prick spurs if they so desire. Masters at Arms wear only a white baldric, a belt worn diagonally across the chest. For the Knights the chain represents the bond of fealty between the crown and His Knight. The white belt is a symbol of chivalry and prowess, which is why both Knights and Masters at Arms wear white belts, albeit in different ways. The spurs come from the days when knights were mounted warriors, and are the symbol of the rank of knight.

- **Award of Arms**
  - An individual may not display arms without a Award of Arms. The crown may grant an individual an Award of Arms allowing them the Title of Lord/Lady of the Court. Giving them the ability to form their own house if they so choose. They may wear a circlet. A circlet is a band worn around the head it may not have any points.

  - This award is given to the winners of the armored and Cut and Trust championship tourneys.
- **Order of the Horn**
  - Granted to houses who show great hospitality.
- **Order of the Crowns Arrow**
  - This award is given to the winner of the Championship tourney.
- **Order of the Sable Cub**
  - This honor is given by the Crown to those children who have demonstrated exceptional courtesy and given of their service or talents to Varggard.
- **Order of the Noble Hearth.**
  - The Order of the Noble Hearth will be given once per year, at the May Championship Tourney, to those individuals whose excellent and regular efforts have created an exceptionally period and well-appointed encampment. The most recent recipient of the award will be given a banner to display, which shall be passed on each year. After the year of holding the initial banner, recipients of this honor will place something on the banner and pass it on to the next year's recipient.
- **Banner Bearer of Varggard.**
  - The Banner Bearer is appointed by the Crown, and will fight by the Crown's side when both are on the field of battle. The Banner Bearer is charged with the possession and maintenance of a banner, given to them by the Crown, bearing Varggards Arms. As the Banner Bearer follows the Crown, so does this honor, and it shall be for the duration of the reign.
